Money

Definitions

- Currency = money in the form of "coins" (metal) or "bills" (paper)
- American money has various "denominations
 - denomination = the value of a single unit of currency
 - ex. "single," "ten", "twenty"
- "Dollar" is from "taler", German for "valley," because German coins were mined from a certain valley
 - the US dollar was originally based on the Spanish silver dollar, or, *real*, which was also called a "peso", "piece of eight" or "real de a ocho"
 - US currency was originally written using the dollar sign "\$" to indicate equal value to a Spanish dollar

• \$128.34 = "a hundred and twenty-eight dollars and thirty-four cents"
