Unfinished business: Covenant & Sacrifice (Lesson 3)

I. The Mass: what Father Barnes wants us to know

- Christ is really there
- It is our glimpse of Heaven
- We are participants and not observers of the Lord's Supper
 - That is why we don't just sit there
 - Participation in Mass is a mindset that begins in the heart
- When we are not at Mass, we are not participating in the Lord's salvation
- Holiness means "setting apart", i.e.,
 - Michael's definition:
 - God is apart from all creation, from sin, from mortal life; thus he is he is perfect, thus "holy"
 - We are to be "set apart for God", i.e. we are called to be holy like God
- We are to reflect God's holiness
- We should bring our personal offerings and intentions to Mass
 - "What are you bringing to the Lord?"
- Sunday is the Lord's Day, it's a commandment
- Communion is a state of grace
 - Thus, when we are in Mass we honor God with reverence
- Daily prayer and confession are part of our communion with God
- Calling God "Father" is a bold statement
