Communion	Since "communion" is "one with
Communion	God," anyone who receives the
	Sacrament of Penance is therefore
	restored into communion with God.
	However, anyone who has
	committed a mortal sin and has not
	received "sacramental absolution,"
	must not receive Holy Communion
	(<u>CCC 1457</u>)
